## Dear Friends!



*It's been another year as we worked on raising funds and supporting women's NGOs and groups which target bringing changes to women's lives. The year of 2013 was full of new, exciting initiatives and events. Mongolian Women's Fund (MONES) was able to expand its domestic fundraising and increase the number of local donors. This year we raised USD 17 633.1 domestically. This is 5.6% higher than our result from the last year. And, we are so proud to report that the amounts of donations we receive from local donors keep increasing.*

*This year, MONES started two new local fundraising initiatives to boost the local fundraising. The first initiative was a VJP reception organized jointly with Parliament Standing Committee on Social Policy, Education, Culture and Science. The reception brought together female Members of Parliament, women in high-level decision-making positions in Government, spouses of Members of Parliament - women who are directly and indirectly involved in governance. The second initiative was the establishment of the long-term partnerships with large Mongolian corporations.*

*Also, this year we celebrated a milestone in our program on Women's Political Participation and organized, together with Women's Caucus in Parliament, a national-level conference "Women: New Environment and New Opportunities". This conference was attended by women elected to Local Councils and rural women-activists to discuss ways of cooperation and develop joint strategies for influencing local policies and decisions. One of the major outcomes of this Conference was a Direction for Cooperation.*

*All these achievements were made possible with the generous help of international Women's Funds, international donors, local organizations, companies, individuals who provided their financial and technical support throughout the year.*

*It should be separately noted that the interesting initiatives proposed by our Board members and Executive team and their active and passionate work was the driving force behind our success.*

*Using this opportunity we would like to express our deepest, heartfelt appreciation to our international and national donors, organizations and individuals, for their time and support, and to our partner-organizations, grantee organizations and groups, volunteers for their hard work.*

Mongolian Women's Fund strives towards making changes in lives of women and girls and hence brings forward issues of violations of women's rights for attention of the public and donors. The funds thus raised support financially women's non-governmental organizations and groups.

## Dissemination of the philanthropic culture and development of the partnership with donors

When we raise funds for fighting women's rights violations we introduce to our donors the issues women and girls from our target groups face and we present the work we do to reduce these violations. So we serve as a bridge between women and girls from one side and donor organizations and individuals from the other.

In 2013, we raised the total of USD 135 970.3 from international and national donors for empowerment of women and girls.



## Strengthening the partnership with international donors

MONES has received support from international Women's Funds and donors that work on the issues of women's rights, human rights, democracy and good governance. The support we received from them contributed to our programs on the reduction of violence against women and the promotion of women's participation in decision-making.

Global Fund for Women and Mama Cash from Netherlands have been our supporters from the very beginning and this year we, again, received grants from these two Funds. This year the two Funds made the important contributions to strengthening the capacity of MONES staff and, particularly, their fundraising capacity. International Network of Women's Funds (INWF), Women's Funding Network (WFN), Asian Network of Women's Funds (ANWF) helped MONES to learn from others and share own achievements and lessons. Taiwan

Foundation for Democracy (TFD), FILIA from Germany and Global Fund for Women made it possible for local women-leaders to conduct a national-level consultation on promoting women's rights and democracy.

Channel Foundation from USA supported the legal advocacy work on reduction and prevention of sexual harassment in work place.

USAID and The Asia Foundation helped us to increase women's participation in good governance and budget monitoring.





## Local Fundraising Program

MONES used many fundraising methods such as fundraising campaigns, events, donation boxes, individual solicitations, small sales, etc. to raise funds locally. As a result, we were able to raise USD 17 633.1 in 2013, which is 5.6% higher than the amount we raised from local sources in 2012.

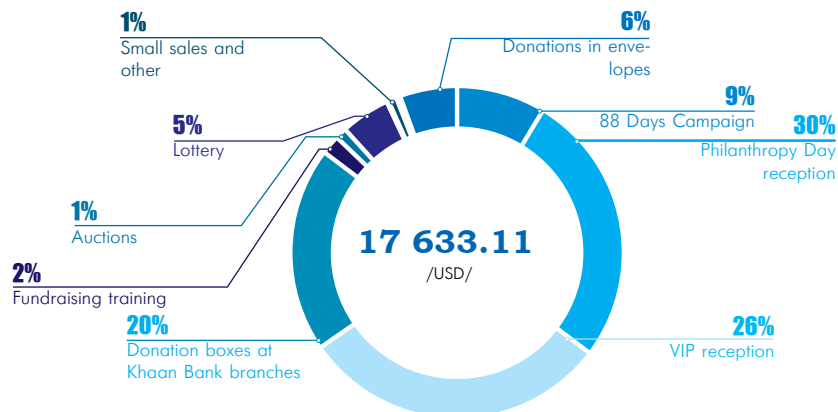
### Strengthening the partnership of local donors and grantee groups

Mongolian Women's Fund received donations from 295 individuals in 2013 and 73 of them were our "repeat" donors and 222 were new donors USD 10 227.2 or 58% of our locally raised funds came from individuals. And, importantly, the average amount of donations we received from individual donors has increased. The funds raised domestically in 2013 were granted to the empowerment of mothers of disabled children and the prevention of sexual abuse of girls.

Our individual donors J.Oyungerel, B.Narantuya, I.Battsetseg lead the 2013 list of donors who contributed to our Philanthropy for Women campaign.



### Breakdown of Local Fundraising





In June, 2013 we organized a meeting of donors with grantee groups and introduced the projects that were implemented with their donations. The groups like Association of Parents of Disabled Children, National Association of Wheelchair Users, Gerel Tushig NGO met with their donors and talked about the projects they implemented.

### New initiative: VIP reception



This year, MONES, jointly with Parliament Standing Committee on Social Policy, Education, Culture and Science, organized a VIP fundraising reception. The reception brought together female Members of Parliament, women in high-level decision-making positions in Government, spouses of Members of Parliament - altogether 59 women who are directly and indirectly involved in governance. The participants of this reception were able to prove that only women can voice women's concerns and only women can better protect women's rights. Moreover, they were able to show that when women work together and produce new initiatives, create new vision, unite their capacities and strengths, the success follows. The donations from this reception were dedicated to the empowerment of mothers of disabled children.





## Partnership with organizations and their donations

• In 2013, MONES placed donation boxes in 23 Khan Bank branches in Ulaanbaatar and collected donations for empowerment of mothers with disabled children. Last year, USD 3 530.3 were collected through these donations boxes.

We organized a year-end meeting with Khan Bank representatives and reported on our grants funded by this partnership.



- Each year MONES organizes 88 Days Campaign that starts on Human Rights Day (December 10th) and ends on International Women's Day (March 8th). In 2013, the 88 Days Campaign was organized under a slogan "Protection of Girls from Sexual Abuse". And, for that, MONES continued its partnership with NGOs that work with young women and girls. Different fundraising activities like organizing trainings on organizational and individual growth, meetings with business organizations were held during this Campaign.





- Together with International Women's Association of Mongolia (IWAM) Mongolian Women's Fund organized a Back-To-School campaign when 200 orphans from Secondary Schools #29, 65, 177 were distributed school bags and stationary donated by IWAM.



The sponsors of MONES media projects were zaluu.com, gogo.mn, Mongolian National Public TV, Mongol TV, MNC and other TVs and websites.

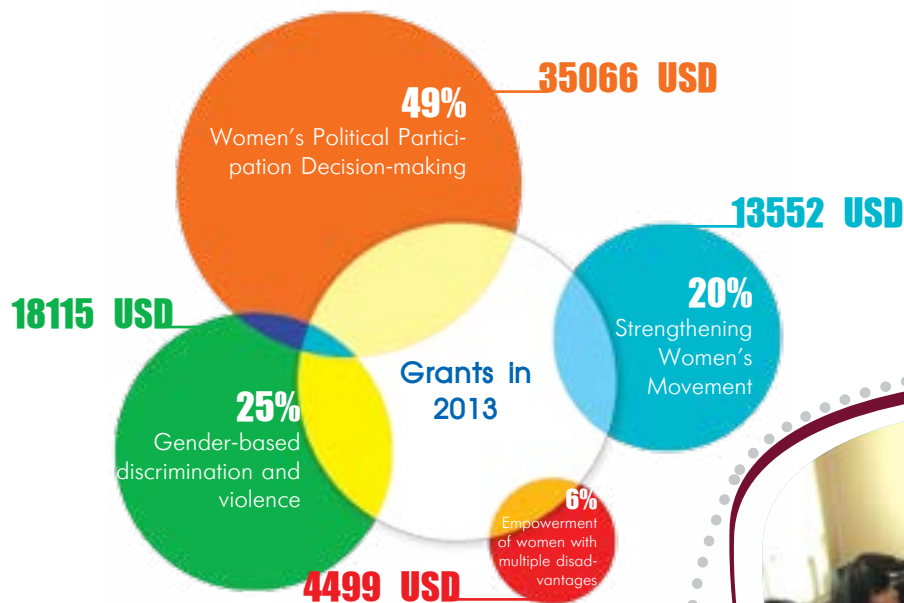




## Grantmaking Program - 2013

The goal of MONES Grantmaking Program is to provide financial support to women's and women-led NGOs and groups to bring social changes in the MONES priority themes. Our priority themes are Reduction of gender-based violence and discrimination, Increasing women's political participation, Strengthening women's movement; and Empowerment of women with multiple disadvantages.

In 2013, MONES distributed USD 71 233.4 to 19 women's NGOs in grants. 49% of the grants were used to support women's political participation, 25% of the grants were given to reduce gender-based violence and discrimination, 20% of the grants helped to support women's movement and 6% were spent to empower women with multiple disadvantages. 11 of the grantees that received grants in 2013 were our old grantees and 8 were new grantees.





## Highlights of the grants:

### "Women: New Environment and New Opportunities" National Conference of women-leaders

For the first time, MONES, together with Women's Caucus in Parliament, organized a national conference "Women: New Environment and New Opportunities". This conference brought together 83 women-leaders from 9 provinces of Mongolia and 9 districts of Ulaanbaatar. The women-leaders were those elected to Local Councils and those leading local women's NGOs. During this conference women discussed how they can work together as one team and influence local policies and decision-making to reduce violations of women's rights and address issues faced by women. Since women, particularly, women in local decision-making bodies and women in local NGOs, are the main driving force that can bring positive changes to local policies, the following directions were identified and agreed upon as the main areas for women's cooperation in years 2013-2016:

- To establish Women's Caucuses in Local Councils and learn from the experience of the Women's Caucus in Parliament
- To develop and strengthen partnership between women's NGOs and women elected to Local Councils, to strive toward bringing social changes together
- To demand the implementation of Law on Gender Equality
- To demand equal access to public services for all citizens, monitor Government and public service organizations whether they fulfill their duties, and advocate for making their work transparent and accountable.





### Reflection by Ch.Surenkhoo, Chair of Local Council of Songinokhairkhan District of Ulaanbaatar:

*Songinokhairkhan District is one of the largest districts of Ulaanbaatar with 32 Khorooos and 262 thousand residents. 16 out of 41 members of the Local Council in our district are women. After attending this Conference I thought of establishing a women's group in Local Council since the number of women elected to the Local Council is high. I will prioritize working in cooperation with women when I get back to the District. We should work together, without being divided by political affiliations, since we have so many issues. I will, also, work with active women-leaders in my Khoroo, where I was elected from.*



## Strengthening women's participation in building transparency of the public service

Mongolia has a population of 2.9 million and 219,250 thousand of that population are children of pre-school age. Only 60.8% of these children attend kindergartens. The main reasons why so many children still cannot attend kindergarten are because kindergartens are not matching the number of children and because of the increasing migration towards cities. Usually, women are the ones who stay at home to look after children when kindergartens cannot accommodate their children. And, many women, especially, young women, become housewives waiting for an available spot in local kindergarten. Yet, information on kindergartens is usually closed and not easily available. Although, everyone understands and accepts that kindergarten is a public service organization, it is still closed to people.

So, the mothers' efforts demanding the transparency and accountability in 4 kindergartens brought changes and these kindergartens now have websites and boards that are regularly updated and open to public. The kindergartens report on their activities, meal programs, budget so that mothers can monitor what happens there and receive information that they need.





## Stopping sexual harassment in work place

From the very beginning MONES paid very close attention to the initiatives and efforts fighting sexual harassment in work place. Grants MONES has distributed targeted policy-makers, public, media, law agencies. In 2013, MONES supported projects on development of training modules for decision-makers, trainings for decision-makers, review of Law on Gender Equality for prevention of sexual harassment in work place. As a result a foundation for services to victims of sexual harassment in workplace has been laid out.

Also, public awareness raising activities were conducted by MONES such as an essay competition among general public and a discussion among women on "Safe Workplace". MONES supported a joint 14-days media campaign on public awareness raising on sexual harassment in workplace conducted together by women's rights and human rights NGOs, private and state organizations including National Gender Committee, National Human Rights Commission, Federation of Trade Unions, National Center Against Violence, Democracy Youth Center, Young Women's Voices Forum, Human Rights and Development Center, Law Clinic of Otgontenger Institute, Diamond Club, etc. This campaign was a strong contribution to influencing public officials, journalists and women.

As a result of these activities draft amendments of Labor Law and other related legislations were developed.

## Empowerment of women with multiple disadvantages

Funds raised from local sources were given as a grant to the women's grassroots groups for empowerment of women with disabled children and empowerment of girls who have children.

- The main challenges of stay-at-home mothers of disabled children are lack of income and stress. So, MONES targeted supporting their income generation in home environment and establishing support groups so that they can meet and talk. The main outcome of the grant was a group of women who supported each other and shared their life lessons, and the increase of their income.

- Girls who gave birth to their children while they were underage girls commonly face discrimination, usually do not finish their school and have no skills for earning money. That's why these girls are unemployed and have weak ability to express themselves. A MONES grant helped to bring this issue up as a social trend and attract attention of decision-makers. On the other hand, this grant helped to organize a Young Mothers' Club, where young mothers can discuss their concerns, develop their goals for future and help each other.

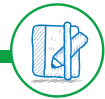

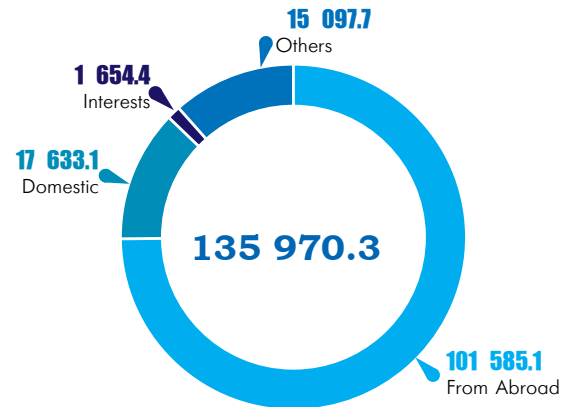

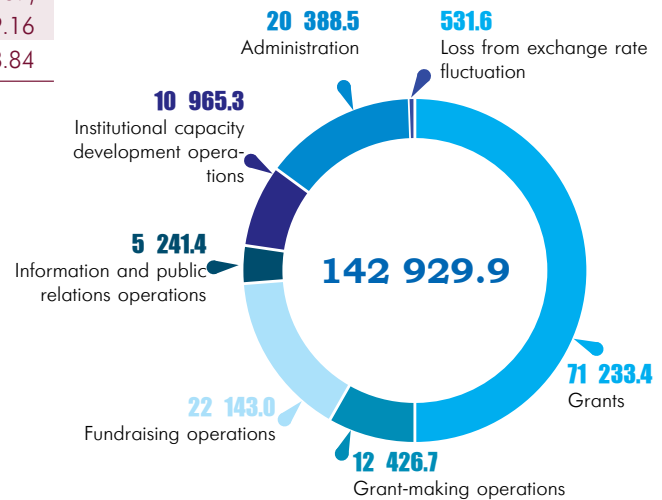
